OLDER YOUTH PROGRAMS

• Chafee (John H. Chafee Foster Care Program for Successful Transition to Adulthood)
The Chafee program provides funding to support youth/young adults in or formerly in foster

care in their transition to adulthood. Individuals in foster care who are 14+ are eligible for a Chafee worker and must be referred by their caseworker. The Chafee worker meets with the youth quarterly to help with education, employment, financial management, housing, emotional support and more. The local Chafee program hosts life skills workshops/classes.

Firefly Supported Living and Employment Services has the Chafee contract for the entire Southwest area. If you have questions about the Chafee program and its services, contact the Firefly office (417-659-9911) and ask to speak with **Linda Donoho** or **Joan Cantrell**. They are Youth Specialists and can direct the teen or their CASA to the correct Chafee worker. • ROYALS: Regional Older Youth Advancement of Life Skills Unit

Affiliated with Children's Division, ROYALS provides case management for older youth who are between 17 and 20 years old. The worker visits the youth 2-4 times per month and they work on goals together. The ROYALS worker teaches life skills (including budgeting, securing employment, finding housing options like transitional/independent living, getting enrolled in driver's education, educational attainment, etc.). They also teach youth how to advocate for themselves in court and at Family Support Team meetings. Jasper County has a targeted caseload of only 12 youth. Educational Talent Search is a federally funded TRIO program designed to assist middle and high school students (grades 6-12) with the necessary understanding, skills, and desire to complete high school and then continue their education. Talent Search serves students who are traditionally underrepresented to explore training and educational options and enroll in postsecondary education. Participants will receive academic advising, information and assistance with the ACT & SAT, professional job shadowing and career exploration, tutoring, college campus visits, and more.
